

FIRST LESSON

GENESIS 1:1-5

A The First Lesson is from the first chapter of Genesis.

In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, 2the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep. while the Spirit from God swept over the face of the waters. 3Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. 4And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. 5God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

²Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his name; worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness.

⁴The voice of the LORD is a powerful voice; the voice of the LORD is a voice of splendor.

⁵The voice of the LORD breaks the cedar trees: the LORD breaks the cedars of Lebanon:

⁶he makes Lebanon skip like a calf, and Mount Hermon like a young wild ox.

⁷The voice of the LORD splits the flames of fire: the voice of the LORD shakes the wilderness: the LORD shakes the wilderness of Kadesh.

⁸The voice of the LORD makes the oak trees writhe and strips the forests bare.

⁹And in the temple of the LORD all are crying, "Glory!"

¹⁰The LORD sits enthroned above the flood;

the LORD sits enthroned as king forevermore.

SECOND LESSON

ACTS 19:1-7

A The second lesson is from the nineteenth chapter of Acts.

While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the interior regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. ²He said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?" They replied, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." ³Then he said, "Into what then were you baptized?" They answered, "Into John's baptism." ⁴Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus." ⁵On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. ⁶When Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied — ⁷altogether there were about twelve of them.


*GOSPEL MARK 1:4–11

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the first chapter.



⁴John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁶Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. ⁸I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

⁹In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. ¹¹And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

He ascended into heaven,


and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
